## Faith & Works

### Different sides of the same coin



"But someone will say, 'You have faith, and I have works.' Show me your faith without your works, and *I will show you my faith by my works.* You believe that there is one God. You do well. Even the demons believe—and tremble! But do you want to know, O foolish man, that *faith without works is dead*? Was not Abraham our father justified by works when he offered Isaac his son on the altar? *Do you see that faith was working together with his works, and by works faith was made perfect?*" James 2:18-22

God has given His creation the wonderful gift of **SALVATION** from His **WRATH**. The state of salvation is achieved when we accept God's grace on His terms. On the day of Pentecost in A.D. 33 the Jews who crucified Jesus came to the realization that He was the Son of God and they asked Peter and the Apostles, "Men and brethren, **what shall we do?**" -Acts 2:37 Peter told them to "**repent and be baptized for the remission of their sins**". After God imparts His grace to us through our acceptance of it He considers us to be in a covenant relation with Him through the blood of Jesus, the Christ. He requires that we **continue to be faithful for the rest of our lives**. The scriptures in the collage on the reverse side of this fold-out all mention **losing your salvation**. Read the verses in your Bible in the context they were written and see the pattern that describes the doctrine that we should "**Work out our own salvation**". -Philippians 2:12 **Faith and works together accomplish this as we follow God's narrow way.**
